## Message from President Jaime Davis

I was privileged to represent our Club at the District 12 Conference in September. It was inspiring to hear of the service and advocacy work in the other clubs in our district, and reminds me that while we have much to do, we can take steps towards achieving our mission! While the Conference was both educational and motivational, I was distressed to hear that membership is down 25% from last year. A membership decline is true of our Club as well. We want to recruit new members, but we also want to retain our current members. Retention occurs when members feel aligned with the work we are doing as well as connected with each other. Please take a quick self-inventory. Is that true for you? Do you believe in the mission of Zonta – to empower women through service and advocacy? Do you support the focus of the local club – to serve and improve the quality of life for our community? Of equal importance, do you feel connected with other Zontians?

A few months ago, we conducted a survey and asked you some of those questions. We are stronger together, and creating a sense of camaraderie in our community will help us work together more effectively. With that in mind, I'm inviting anyone who is able to join me for coffee! # A FLASH FROM THE PAST: THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article.

This amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification.

The Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was first proposed by Alice Paul in 1923. On March 22, 1972, it was passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives. It was sent to the states for ratification, and women would finally have equal rights pursuant to the U.S. Constitution if it was passed by 38 states within seven years. Easy? Not so much. Even with the deadline for ratification extended to June 30, 1982, only 35 states ratified the amendment. The result: women did not obtain the same constitutional protections as men – and still have not.

Now, we have a second chance opportunity. Resolutions have been introduced in both the U.S. House of Representatives (H.J. Res 53) and the Senate (S.J. Res. 5) to extend the ratification period and lift any deadline for getting those last three states. (Note: Nevada ratified this year, so only two more are needed!)

However, we must get these resolutions passed through Congress. Please consider contacting your Senators and Representative. While each of the four states in District 12 have passed this amendment (although South Dakota did rescind its ratification), this does not matter as long as there is no opportunity to extend the ratification deadline. Want to do some advocacy? Here is your chance!

Kristie started the meeting at 5:37 p.m.

Amanda presented the budget for review. The budget has been updated and the last piece that needs to be entered is entering members to keep track of who is up-to-date on their dues.

Denise reported that there is money still sitting in the ZLNO account that will be coming to the club to pay the ZI foundation for this year and last year.

Brenda observed that we are still checking into which member paid with cash and we do not know who that money belongs to.

Brenda had a member ask about the meeting meals - if they don't eat, do they still need to pay for a meal? The board decided not to collect money for those that aren't eating.

### Committee Reports

No new member applications to report at this time.

Navigator Report - Kristie reviewed the list for members to contact. It was encouraged the board members to contact their assigned people by Monday so they can RSVP by Tuesday for the upcoming meeting. Remind the members of the upcoming meeting and that we are having the silent auction and be prepared to shop.

Melissa - 1-2 weeks is needed to prep press releases. Kristie recommended that we need more people as administrators on FaceBook so people can post immediately. Denise has the high-res graphics for the banner, this is close to being completed!

Finance for ZLNO reported by Denise. The Little American contract has been signed and \$1000 deposit has been paid. Misti is working on setting up meetings to work on tickets. Joani is co-chairing. Morgan and Jennica offered to help as well. Amanda will attend to provide a financial perspective.

Service – Jennica asked members to support the Frontier United Methodist Church the next bake prep day on Saturday, 8 a.m. - it is a great way to connect with other Zontians and support the church who will donate all profits to the Boys and Girls Club.

Array School of Design - Jennica and Jody recommended that we support the women in the program. The cost for the 6 month program is \$15,000. We have several options, create a scholarship, give a grant - \$500 per year? The board asked Jennica to get more information and we'll discuss again next month.

Amanda and Jaime attended Triumph High School's Open House and were able to connect with students. Michelle Aldrich reported that the club elected officers and will hold their first meeting will be the first Wednesday in October.

Lisa will take care of getting silhouettes for the walk kicking of the 16 days of activism. She will also reach out to the city for a permit and connect with Michelle Aldrich and Mary Walker for more information. Denise recommend we get in touch with the coordinators of the women's march to get the word out for the Silent Witness Silhouette.

Kristie encouraged members to send out the Art Contest Flyer and recruit artist as soon as possible! We are limiting artists to one submission each. Kristie is talking with the LCSD#1 Art Director about their submissions.

Legislative Watch - Denise will update district information and share that with us.

Denise reported on Colorado Business and Professional Women showing of "Equal Means Equal" documentary. It was recommended that we show this film in Cheyenne, more information is coming.

#### Additional Business -

Jaime proposed allocating the money from symposium (in which no one attended) to the District 12. It was moved that \$120 be given to each of the 5 members attending by Amanda and seconded by Jennica. Melissa & Jaime will be delegates and Kathy and Denise are the alternates. Motion carried.

Denise moved that we have Misti Fisher, Joani Hafner, and Amanda Roberts as signatures on the ZLNO First Education Bank account and remove all other names. Seconded by Kristie. Motion carries.
