Message from the President Women's Rights are Human Rights

October 24, 2020 marks the 75th anniversary of the founding of the United Nations. It is a time to reflect on the past, celebrate the accomplishments of the present and look forward to progress–toward a better and brighter future for everyone.

There are plenty of reasons people find to take issue with the United Nations – but let's focus for a moment on the positive. Zonta has achieved many successful service projects by partnering with various entities that are part of the United Nations.

Each of the current Zonta International service projects are being done in partnership with either UNICEF (the United Nations Children's Fund) or UNFPA (the United Nations Population Fund). These projects include: Ending Child Marriage; Empowering Girls through Education; Helping with the Recovery of Women who are Gender-Based Violence Survivors; and Improving the Health of Adolescent Girls and Working to Protect Them from Violence. It is hard to imagine Zonta being able to have

the impact we have internationally without partnering with the United Nations

Ten years ago, the United Nations established a branch -- United Nations Women -- that is dedicated to gender equality and the empowerment of women. It works with governments and civil society to make the vision of gender equality a reality for women and girls around the globe. It recognizes that empowering women fuels thriving economies.

As Zontians, we have differing views about the work of the United Nations. But, please remember that it is our partner in doing much of the good work that we have supported and engaged in for many years. Zonta, and the United Nations, have the goal of making the world a better place.

We still have much work to do, and sometimes we stumble along the way. However, we must continue our quest to get the world to recognize that *gender equality is a basic human right*. That is what we do as Zontians. As long as the United Nations is willing to partner with us to try to achieve that mission I, for one, am happy for its help.

Governor's Seminar Summary

The District 12 Governor's Seminar was held on September 26th following an opening dinner gala the previous night. The dinner gala was held in a beautiful room at the Gallery at the Metropolitan, with fantastic food, amazing service, plus a magic and musical performance by Elvis.

The morning of the seminar began with a beautiful version of the National Anthem by Cheyenne Harmony, of which our own Kathy Orr and Donna Angel are members. We then learned about the Zonta international service projects for the upcoming biennium, changes to the Zonta International bylaws, and the focus to be put on member retention.

As part of the member retention report, there was discussion of *what*

members want that included: understanding issues; fulfillment through contribution; friendships and supportive relationships; training and experience in learning new skills; networking; mentoring; and to just have some fun.

The morning continued with a tribute to the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg. Most of the rest of the morning and early afternoon were filled with reports about various Zonta activities, hearing from District 12 officers and members of the leadership team. A number of awards to Zontians and Zonta Clubs were also provided. One of the notable moments was when the Zonta Club of the Pikes Peak Area was awarded both the District 12 Service Award and the Advocacy

Award. Additionally, the Zonta Club of Cheyenne received the *First Time Attendees Award* for having the most first-time attendees at a Governor's Seminar or District Convention.

The keynote speaker was Jackie Parker from

Strong Families Strong Wyoming. This is an entity whose mission is to help youth build better futures and better relationships for a stronger Wyoming. She discussed the work being done with youth including: healthy relationship education; providing parenting skills; teaching financial literacy; career exploration; and teaching how to navigate social media safely.

The rest of the seminar was primarily spent in training sessions where participants could select from two of four offered sessions. Our own

Kathy Cathcart taught a session on Zonta leadership opportunities, and Denise Parrish conducted a session on advocacy. The other two sessions were on Zonta resources on leadership and training workshops, and tips for being a successful committee chair.

Forty-two people registered to attend the Governor's Seminar in-person and about another twenty were registered to participate through Zoom. There were some technical difficulties involving the on-line aspects of the meeting but in general, those attending in person were quite satisfied.

Finally, The 2021 District 12 Governor's Conference is scheduled for September 24-26 in Colorado Springs.
