

The COVID-19 pandemic has severely impacted students around the world. Closures continue to disrupt the education of more than 616 million students. The READ Act Reauthorization (HR 681/S 41) will help develop a comprehensive US strategy to improve educational opportunities and address key barriers to attendance, especially for girls, who suffer the impacts of this disruption to a much greater extent than boys.

Children of mothers with 12 years of education are 30% less likely to die before age 5. For each year of school completed, for a girl in a poor country, wages increase by 20%. Girls without education are three times as likely to marry before age 18 as those with secondary education. Early marriage is a high risk factor in acquiring HIV.

Member Meeting Minutes

Zonta member Meeting - April

Austin from the unaccompanied student initiative gave a presentation about what they do - explained how they help kids from 16-20 who experience homelessness and help them graduate and get out on their own.

Denise gave the advocacy report - they have lots going on for coasters, and posters; got a response from East and South high schools for social media videos. They are purchasing some kits for in her shoes a teen version. They are working on the art project, the deadline is May 15th and the reception is May 22 from 5:30-7pm at the civic center where the art will be hung.

Dasa's treasurer report was given - we have an ending balance of \$2716.17

Belinda talked about the communications committee - they are going to work on revamping the website and getting more help with social media – Tracy Myers will be taking over the newsletter once Michelle Huff is deployed. Pam has agreed to take over social media. Meetings will be the second Monday of each month, next one is May 8th at Paris West at 5:30pm

Betty's membership report – member orientation was in March and was a great turnout – there are 9 new members. The committee worked on a policy for flowers and when they should be sent for occasions.

Belinda gave a report on Cancel Out - we made \$17,000 on table sales, \$9,000 on sponsors, individual sales was \$3675, silent auction items was \$3387, live auction was \$4550, raffle was \$1440, \$350 was given back as donations, wine grab was \$2150, other donations was \$1250- with a total of \$42,802 and after expenses we had \$25,977.83

Melissa Martin – reported on foundation information and they recommended that \$8500 be given to Zonta international, \$3000 was donated to Cheyenne Zonta and not needed to be paid back, \$20,000 will be donated to the stages project for the medical clinic. Also, \$7000 will be donated to the club for scholar-ships and other costs.

There was a motion from Linda Bogart for the \$20,000 to be paid to the Stages project, seconded by Dasa Roberts and Barabra World. We did not have a quorum so Michelle will send that out for an electronic vote.

Linda Bogart spoke about Hope Bags and how they have \$7000 for that and have been shopping and keeping up with those.

Michele discussed the area meeting out at archer as a reminder 9-4 April 15th

Kristy Wilson discussed Wyogives and asked if the club would like to participate. There will need to be a chair that will head that up. It was asked that she give a write up on what the chair would be responsible for doing.

Michelle talked about elections and positions being voted on and that she would be sending out an email for nominations and installation of officers in May.
