Debbie's Story

A mom lost her daughter to domestic violence. Now, she's losing faith in the law.

Debbie Richardson knew her daughter was in danger.

Crystal Town had seemingly escaped a bad situation. The 29-year-old was in recovery from a substance use disorder, had moved out of the Cheyenne home she once shared with her abusive husband, Christopher, and had filed for divorce. But Debbie was still afraid.

The days after leaving an abuser are often the <u>most dangerous time</u> for a victim of domestic violence. And Christopher was angry that Crystal was ending their marriage. He was struggling with bipolar disorder and self medicat-

ing with drugs and alcohol. He had a gun.



Zonta works to curtail human trafficking by raising awareness

ccasionally in these pages, we're called upon to discuss serious issues and share them with folks in our neighborhood. This is one of those moments; our recent conversation with Belinda Savyer, a Pointe resident, was both sobering and enlightening. She shared information about human trafficking and domestic violence in Cheyenne

shout human trafficking and domestic violence in Cheyenne and introduced us to an organization working to address those crimes by empowering women and girls. Both Belinda and the organization Zonta are worth knowing more about, as is the work they do.

While she originally hails from Livingston, Montana, Belinda has called Cheyenne home for the last 23 years. Currently, she works as a Realtor for RE/MAX Capitol Properties as part of the team Welcome Home with Pam Pafford and Belinda Sawyer but devotes much of her time to volunteering. In particular, she and Pam Pafford work with Zonta, an organization that believes in "making the

world a better place by empowering women." While Zonta promotes and supports a variety of programs around the world, of particular concern to us is their work fighting human trafficking and domestic violence in our own city. "The biggest thing about their cause is that it does empower women and girls, but the biggest thing for Cheyenne is the awareness of human trafficking and domestic violence," Belinda told us. "That's what I'm passionate about with Cheyenne being on the 128 and 180 corridor there's a lot of human trafficking going on in our small community." She went on to note that many Cheyenne residents are unaware of how prevalent these issues are locally: "People aren't aware of that, they get surprised when we tell them. They think 'oh we're too small a town." locally: "People aren 1 aware or that, they get surprised when we tell them. They think 'oh we're too small a town.' Same thing with domestic violence; it's very well hidden but it happens here, even among people that we're possibly friends with. They're both definitely huge things that impact

our community."

Belinda went on to explain some of Zonta's local efforts to make things better: "In Cheyenne, the one event that was just had is called 'Cancel Out Domestic Violence that was just had is called 'Cancel Out Domestic Violence and Human Traffiching'. It's a big finndraiser we put on to raise community awareness plus a fundraiser that went to support a project that we are working on this year. It's called 'Stages', it supports COMEA [Cooperative Ministry for Emergency Assistance]—our local community shelter. They're renovating a disused hotel next to their facility to be used as a transitional housing location. The money we raised goes towards a medical facility attached to their new housing."

As with all things Cheyenne, Frontier Days is a big part of Zonta's plans for the year: "During Cheyenne Frontier Days, we tape up filers in restrooms, restaurants, bars, and various locations with support information for human trafficking and domestic violence. We hand out coasters with the same information on them so if someone's in trouble they have the number right there. We also have a booth set up downtown during the parades that highlight what Zonta does, further raising community awareness."





Zonta's local efforts include their Silent Witness March, a powerful statement about the impact human trafficking has on families. The loved ones of human trafficking the forest the silent march, carrying along with them a human-sized silhouette representing who they've lost. Fer Belinda 'it raises quite a bit of awareness."

Belinda left us with one final thought, regarding the pervasive natures of both human trafficking and domestic voluence. "It's all families, it's not just low income, everyone's affected."
