
District 12 Conference


Conference—continued...

Member Meeting Minutes

The October Zonta Club Meeting was held on September 14, 2023, at the Dining Room on the LCCC Campus. The meeting was called to order at 6:00pm by Dr. Michelle Aldrich.

Guest Speaker, Sam Shumway, State Director of AARP Wyoming, gave the presentation. Please see recap of his presentation on page 10.

Minutes of the last meeting: The minutes of the August meeting were approved as presented. Motion made, seconded and passed.

Treasurer's report: There being no questions or corrections, it has been filed for audit.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Advocacy: The Silent Witness March is scheduled for Monday, November 20, at noon. The Art Show Reception is tentatively scheduled for February 5 at the Civic Center. Art will need to be removed from the Civic Center soon after the reception because the school district art show will begin on February 8. We can display the art for our art show ahead of the reception, possibly as early as mid-January. The next meeting of the Advocacy Committee is Monday, September 18, 5:30pm at Denise Parrish's home.

Communications: Communications Committee met jointly with Membership Committee. Tracy Myers is working on using a different program for the newsletter that works better with links. Caroline D'Ambro is working on keeping the calendar current. The committee is working on Cancel Out save-the-date on the website, as well as putting information about it on Facebook and creating a Facebook event to get it publicized. Caroline created a card to be included in each Hope Bag to identify that the club provided it. The next committee meeting will be a joint meeting with the Membership Committee on October 2.

Membership: Membership Committee met jointly with Communications Committee. The committee is working on ways to recruit new members and retain existing members. They have discussed the idea of pop-up Zappy Hour events. These would be somewhat spontaneous evening social events (2-3 day notice) at various locations in town. New member brochure packets are being updated. The committee is planning new member orientation to happen four times per year, with chairs of the other standing committees participating to provide a better overview of activities available to new members. Alternate locations are being sought for future meetings in an effort to lower costs for both members and the club. The November 9 meeting will be held at Westby Edge. The December meeting would normally be a noon meeting via Zoom, but will instead be an evening in-person meeting at Belinda Sawyer's house. The party will include white elephant gifts and we will also collect items to donate as gifts to Safehouse. Zunco will be on September 28 at Paris West, 5:30pm. \$15.00 fee. Guests are welcome. The next committee meeting will be a joint meeting with the Communications Committee on October 2.

Cancel Out: The Committee is planning a silent auction featuring 15 -20 items with approx. value of \$100, and a live auction featuring 5-10 items of higher value. We will also have the Bottle Grab during the event. It will be held at the Cheyenne Frontier Days Event Center on March 8, and will be catered by Girls Gone Gourmet. The

next planning meeting will be September 29 at 11:30am, at ReMax.

OLD BUSINESS

By Laws have been updated to conform with Zonta International and also to conform with what we have been doing locally, as well as to streamline committee structure. The proposed By Laws have been provided electronically, and copies were also available at the meeting. The following amendments to the proposed ByLaws were presented:

Article V, Section 3. Donations in Honor of Members. A motion was made and seconded, to change the wording of this section. Instead of providing a donation to the Zonta Foundation for Women only upon the death of a Club member, the revised wording provides for a donation upon death of a current member or a former member upon recommendation by the Board. The motion passed unanimously.

Article X, Section 1. How Constituted. A motion was made and seconded to change the term of members of the Nominating Committee from one year to two years. The motion passed unanimously by oral vote.

A motion was then made and seconded to adopt the proposed By Laws as amended. The motion passed unanimously by oral vote.

The District meeting is this weekend, with spots still available for those who wish to attend.

Other old business: None.

NEW BUSINESS

Meeting format: There was discussion regarding going back to monthly evening meetings instead of alternating between evening and noon meetings. Discussion continued, and the vote was to have meetings continue to alternate with evening and noon meetings, and for the noon meetings to be held via Zoom.

Assembly of Hope Bags: will be done on October 21 at approximately 9:30am at Grace United Methodist Church. Anyone who can help transport items from the storage unit to the church should meet at 8:30am at the storage unit.

Cancel Out: The planning committee proposed distribution of net proceeds from the event as follows: 40% to Wyoming Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, 10% to Zonta Foundation, and 50% to Zonta Club. Following discussion of this proposal, it was agreed the planning committee will revisit the subject at its next meeting on September 29. The committee will seek additional information from the Coalition to better define how any funds donated by the Club would be used. The distribution of net proceeds will also be discussed. There will be further discussion of these topics at the October membership meeting.

Other new business: None.

How Artificial Intelligence (AI) is Changing the Fraud and Scam Game

Guest Speaker: Sam Shumway, State Director of AARP Wyoming.

Older Americans lose an estimated \$28.3 Billion annually to fraud. Wyomingites were hit for \$78 Million in fraud losses in 2021 alone. SF24 passed last year. It allows banks and credit unions to put up to a five day hold on transactions of vulnerable adults that they suspect may be fraud. Thirty-four other states have passed similar laws. "Vulnerable adult" is defined as over eighteen years old and unable to manage money, assets, or property without assistance because of age or a physical or mental disability.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is changing things. AI is a branch of computer science that aims to create machines that can perform tasks traditionally requiring human intelligence. Mr. Shumway demonstrated an AI site entitled ChatGPT. Within minutes, he generated scam email messages to an acquaintance of his using information gleaned from her Facebook account, customizing those messages to lengthen, shorten, and make them more personal in nature. ChatGPT is a very new

form of this technology. It is expected the technology will advance quickly, making it all the more difficult to differentiate computer generated messages from messages created by humans, likely leading to still more scam efforts. Other uses of technology to create scam messages include voice cloning in which a fake message is created which sounds very real because the voice of a friend or loved one has been cloned.

Older adults are especially vulnerable to scam activity because of digital naivety, cognitive decline, social isolation, and access to disposable funds. Protection against such scams includes close scrutiny of sender information to make sure the message is actually from whomever appears to be the sender and to be very skeptical of messages received, particularly those asking for money. 
