

The Rights of Women During Conflict

At the time of the attack on Israel by Hamas on October 7, 2023, I was alarmed by the reports of violent assaults, rape, and murder of women in Israel. I didn't see the statement of Zonta International issued 21 October 2023. Thank you to Renée Coppock and Denise Parrish for bringing these statements to my attention.

'Zonta calls, per UN Security Council Resolution 1325, on all parties to "respect fully international law applicable to the rights and protection of women and girls, especially as civilians." UN Security Resolution 1325 further "calls on all parties to armed conflict to take special measures to

protect women and girls from gender-based violence, particularly rape and other forms of sexual abuse, and all other forms of violence in situations of armed conflict."

For more actions we can take to advocate for women and girls in conflict situations, please refer to Zonta International's Statement on Women's Rights in Armed Conflict and Post-Conflict Settings.

Again, I want to thank our Advocacy Representatives for showing us the response Zonta International has taken to the horrific war crimes against women and children that have been committed in Israel and continuing in Gaza.


Cancel Out Updates




December Zappy Hour Fun

This human trafficking awareness training will cover federal and local laws, identification and complexities of disclosure, and local resources to support survivors. We will explore root causes of trafficking and the myriad of intersecting identities, vulnerabilities, and social and systemic inequalities that can lead to trafficking. Understanding root causes and complex trauma is key to recognizing the crime in its many forms.


