

I look forward to seeing all of you there!




Cancel Out Updates






Red Sand Project being planned for Cheyenne

The Advocacy Committee is planning to have a Red Sand Project in June. What is a Red Sand Project? A good subject to Google where you can learn a lot about it. The idea is to fill available sidewalk cracks with the special purified, sterilized red sand from the project to bring attention to the victims of human trafficking who have fallen through the cracks. We intend to expand our focus to include victims of interpersonal violence. We're hoping to have all of Cheyenne Zonta involved to some extent.

In June our Red Sand Project is set to make a powerful impact with pop-up installations around Cheyenne. These unique places will provide an opportunity for members (and friends) to actively participate in raising awareness about victims of human trafficking and domestic violence. You will choose a location that you think will have good exposure and that is conducive to starting a short conversation, you get permission to set up in front of the establishment, then sign up to secure your spot choosing a date that suits you. We hope to have a list of places that have already been contacted by our committee. See Jody Gostas or Ilaine Brown for more information.



Minutes of the last meeting: Minutes of the last meeting were previously presented in the Zephyr. There being no questions or corrections, it was moved and seconded to adopt the minutes as presented. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report: The Treasurer's report was provided through the monthly newsletter. There being no questions or corrections, the report has been filed for audit.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Advocacy

The Art Contest reception is scheduled for April 15. Entries are due April 1. The Red Sand project is being planned for late spring/early summer. "What Was She Wearing" will take place at Laramie County Community College, April 1-8. The LCCC athletics program is looking for ways for participants to volunteer in some of our activities. The committee is investigating the cost and logistics of using coffee cup sleeves to share contact info we put on our coasters and posters during Cheyenne Frontier Days. Casper, WY is working on forming a Zonta Club.

Communications/Membership

We have not received any new membership applications. The joint Communications/Membership committee is working with the Cancel Out Committee to increase exposure of the event. The committee is looking for ways to recruit new members as well as retain current members and increase membership participation in various club projects and events.

Cancel Out

Cancel Out is scheduled for March 8 at the CFD Event Center. Terry Markham of Uprising will speak together with a male coworker who was a trafficking victim. Uprising is the approved beneficiary of a portion of this year's Cancel Out proceeds. We are looking for event sponsors and people to buy tables or individual tickets for the event. Cheyenne Frontier Days has agreed to donate the \$2,500 facility fee. We need donations of wine/alcohol for the Bottle Grab, as well as items for the Silent Auction (preferably at least \$100) and the

Live Auction (at least \$500).

OLD BUSINESS

Nominating Committee: The committee is working and will report at the February membership meeting.

Other Old Business: None.

NEW BUSINESS

Dr. Aldrich reported about some legislation that Sen. Affie Ellis plans to present during the upcoming legislative session. One will be to limit registered sex offenders from going to commercial child friendly places. The other will be to create a statute criminalizing manual stimulation for money. We should be watching for these and do what we can to encourage our legislators to consider them.

January is the month we honor Amelia Earhart. Zonta is the only non-aeronautical group to which she belonged. Some interesting facts about her:

- o Born July 24, 1897, in Atchison, KS.
- o In 1928 she was the first female passenger to cross the Atlantic by airplane.
- o In 1932 she was the first female aviator to fly solo across the Atlantic.
- o In 1935 she became a visiting faculty member at Purdue University as an advisor to aeronautical engineering and career counselor to female students.
- o She was an early supporter of the Equal Rights Amendment.
- o In 1935 she was the first person to fly solo from Hawaii to California.
- o Also in 1935, she was the first person to fly solo from Los Angeles to Mexico City.
- o She disappeared on July 2, 1937 during an attempt to fly around the world. She was declared dead on January 5, 1939.

Members present donated a total of \$282 for the Amelia Earhart Fellowship at the conclusion of the meeting.

Michelle Huff, a Zonta Club of Cheyenne member, is currently deployed and is a member of the first all-female crew of a C-140 military plane.

Other new business: None.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15pm.
