Another year, another successful art contest

As has become our tradition for the past decade, the Zonta Club of Cheyenne hosted an Annual Art Contest to raise awareness about various aspects of violence against women. We invited artists – young, old, experienced, inexperienced, professional, amateur – to submit pieces to reflect their views of surviving interpersonal violence. We received 16 fantastic pieces – drawings, paintings, a 3-D shadow- box, a poem, and even an autobiographical story. A jury of three independent judges selected the winners of the contest for each of the three age categories. The fourth prize was a people's choice award. Each of the winners received a \$200 prize.

The Art was displayed in the lobby of the Cheyenne Civic Center for most of the month of April. On the evening of April 15 th, we held a free reception at the Cheyenne Civic Center which artists and their families, Zontians, and the general public were invit-

ed to attend. This was an opportunity to view the contest entries, hear the announcement of the contest winners, nibble on some charcuterie, watch art being created live (thanks to Paula

Egan-Wright), and engage in some participatory art opportunities.

The Zontians hosting the reception were quite pleased with the participation of the public and the interaction we were able to have with those who attended.

Our thanks to all who assisted with the contest and with the reception itself. Several of the art pieces were donated to the Club. We can use them to display at other events and /or may wish to include a few of the pieces in the silent auction at next year's CANCEL OUT fundraiser.

We hope to continue our annual tradition and cur-

rently plan to host a 2025 contest. Specific themes and logistics will be forthcoming.











2024 D12 Area 2 Meeting held in Cheyenne

The 2024 D12 Area 2 meeting was moved from Douglas to Cheyenne this year, and the task of organizing and planning was taken on by Denise Parrish, who did an amazing job in a short amount of time, to plan an amazing meeting!

Friday night, we met for Dining and Discourse at The Office Bar & Grill, where we socialized with fellow Zontians from Cheyenne, Colorado and Montana. We also had a presentation by our own Melissa Martin, who gave us tips about small talk and how to start conversations. She also helped with our skills used to talk to others about Zonta.

Saturday morning began with a Presentation of the Colors by the girls from Scouts BSA Troop 1869, and the Star Spangled Banner was sung by Ashlie Giesick. Next we heard Zonta updates from Dist 12 President, Bridget Masters. Renee Coppock, a Zonta International Board member shared information and photos with us about some international projects.

After a short break to shop and buy raffle tickets, Brian Martin, Managing Editor of the Wyoming Tribune Eagle spoke to us about how to use various forms of media to spread Zonta's message, including how to best prepare information when approaching media outlets about covering our events and projects.

Next, we had a Membership report by Debbie Sundberg, Dist 12 Governor-Elect who also teamed up with Denise Parrish to lead us in a Membership activity, which included discussing why we do or don't talk to others about Zonta, how to create conversation about Zonta and we practice creating and delivering our elevator speech about Zonta.

Deedee Boysen and Sheila Davis, Dist 12 Club Creators spoke about their ideas for creating new Zonta Clubs and where there are new clubs beginning. They also shared a little with us about e-clubs, which are online clubs for those without a Club close to them, or those who wish to not attend events in person.

Next, Julie Trone, Chair of Dist 12 AEGE Committee shared details about the Action for Environment and Gender Equity Committee, and how the environment is linked to gender equity, and the lack-thereof. And before lunch, we had an insightful presentation from Cara Boyle Chambers, Director for the Division of Victim Service, Wyoming Office of the Attorney General. Cara spoke to us about her experience with both the Wyoming Human Trafficking task force, the Missing and Murdered Indigenous People, and what she has learned about how delicate the relationship is between the two.

After lunch, Denise Parrish provided an insightful presentation on Advocacy and ideas to increase Zonta's presence and further the agenda through Advocacy projects. This was followed with a club roundtable where a representative from each club shared successes, challenges, fundraising and activities. It was amazing for everyone to share and learn new ideas!

Kudos to Denise on all her hard work in organizing the meeting, including finding smeeting spaces, speakers, the Scout troop, the singer, arranging meals, and creating fun goodie bags for all attendees and a special gift for all first-time attendees.

Highlights Of Advocay & Service Committee Meeting

On May 13, 2024, eight Zontians and one guest met together to discuss a wide variety of current and potential future activities. The first project discussed was the upcoming Red Sand Project that Jody Gostas and Ilaine Brown have been planning. In light of Ilaine's extended absence (we wish her good health and healing), Jill Randall (welcome) has stepped up to help finalize some of the logistics of this project. More details to come.

We next discussed our usual July distribution of coasters and posters that share the domestic violence hotline number and human trafficking hotline number. 15,000 coasters have been ordered. The poster is being updated. Kathy Orr has offered to contact Cheyenne Frontier Days folks to see if we can distribute on the CFD grounds. Kimberly Bowie (welcome) has offered to discuss the distribution route lists with other Zontians (especially Betty) to see what updates are needed.

We then entered into a wide-ranging discussion with our guest, Mandie Shattuck, about future projects that could be explored. Mandie introduced herself as an artist (she offered some pieces in the Art Contest), a survivor of interpersonal violence, and a person concerned about abuse she sees happening impacting one of her neighbors. Some of the suggestions discussed included: creating a website (with a QR) of one-stop resources that would be easy to use by an individual experiencing violence; exploring whether calling 2-1-1 would provide an adequate list of resources for survivors; creation of a day space where a victim leaving her abuser could go to catch-herbreathe and figure out next steps before entering an oftcrowded and chaotic sheltering process; learning about

the services of Safehouse and specifically whether it helps victims plan how-to-leave-her-abuser safely; creating a soft room with the sheriff / police department where victims may be interviewed about her abuse (rather than a harsh interrogation room); and hosting or helping to coordinate a meeting of all the service providers involved with domestic violence survivors to better understand any gaps in the system.

We closed out the meeting by discussing items that might be of interest to the group beyond Violence Against Women. There is continuing interest in trying to engage or partner with Girls on the Run. There was also interest (especially by Barbara World) in taking on the issue of Elder Abuse and educating seniors about how to selfadvocate on issues whether it be related to the rights of a person in a nursing home or fighting back when financial scams occur.

We had a wonderful mix of long-standing Zontians and brand-new members in attendance! And, that did not even include some of the folks that want to work mostly on Hope Bags or 16 Days of Activism. It is an exciting, enthusiastic, energetic, group of passionate people with whom to be conversing. Please feel free to join us at The Office Bar and Grill for our next meeting on June 10th at 5:30 p.m.


